Who calls for help

In addressing the needs and issues of former and current members who are, or who have been, harmed by cultic groups it is important to remember there is often an overlooked population of people who are affected. These people include immediate family members as well as other relatives, friends and co-workers, who are in need of information, support and help.

This population finds itself struggling with feelings of loss and grief as well as trying desperately to understand a situation which is foreign to them and for which they generally have no frame of reference for understanding. The situation these individuals have to come to grips with can range from seeing a loved one's behavior change dramatically to having been abducted by another family member.

The implications for their mental health cannot be under-estimated when one considers these people often experience feelings of helplessness, isolation, guilt and shame.

Who Is Info-Cult

Founded in 1980, Info-Cult is a non-profit charity organization that helps people concerned or interested about cults, new religious movements and related phenomena.

Our services include :
an information and assistance phone line, consultation, research, conferences, documentation centre and an internet site.

Moreover, without accurate information well, meaning loved ones can sometimes respond in ways which make a precarious situation worse, estranging themselves from the person they are concerned for. In other cases, these individuals may simply jump to erroneous conclusions, causing themselves undo anxiety and damaging their relationship at a sensitive time.

At Info-Cult we recognize how important it is that people have access to accurate information, in addition to understanding and support during the difficult period they are going through.

Info-Cult takes calls from concerned families, friends, co-workers and others on a regular basis and provides information and assistance to these individuals.
