## News from Info-Cult

### More than 75,000 ...

Since 1980 Info-Cult has responded to more than **75,000** inquiries. In the first few years the majority of requests were from worried parents whose son or daughter was involved in a “cult”, and who were often looking for a way to get their child out of the group.

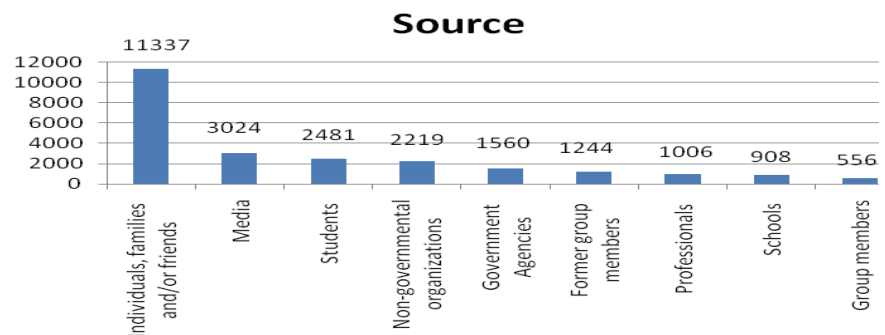
Since those early days there has been a change in the requests we receive which now cover a broad range of questions and concerns. Requests are received from among others, professionals, community and religious organizations, government agencies and media. What has remained constant throughout the years are the calls we receive concerning an individual involved with a group. Since 1980 Info-Cult received **11,337** requests of this nature.

### Who Is Info-Cult

Founded in 1980, Info-Cult is a non-profit charitable organization that helps people concerned or interested about cults, new religious movements and related phenomena.

Our services include :  
an information and assistance phone line, consultation, research, conferences, documentation centre and an internet site.

The graph to the right shows the source of a selection of the requests we've received since 1980.



Numbers, however, do not reveal the individual stories that are hidden behind those thousands of calls. I'd like to share two recent ones with you:

**Mary\*** found out recently that for the past 6 years her 76 year old mother has been in contact by regular mail with “*channelers\*\**” who reside overseas. Her mother had kept her communications with these people secret from her family. The *channelers* had been sending instructions about rituals her mother had to carry out that would improve her health and wealth. These instructions came at a cost and her mother who is living on a pension had very little left after sending these people money. Mary called us as it became evident to her and her family that her mother was becoming increasingly stressed in her attempts to complete all the rituals she was being told to do. We are working with Mary in looking at different approaches that might get her mother to reflect on her families concerns and reassess what she's involved with.

Thirty years after leaving his group **John\*** started experiencing blackouts. He had grown up with his family in a group where he had been sexually and physically abused. Upon reaching the age of majority he left the group and since then had suppressed his experiences. He contacted Info-Cult after

having run the gamut of professionals and agencies he had gone to seeking help concerning his blackouts. He couldn't find anyone who would consider or hear about his group experience as a possible cause. We knew the group he had grown up in and had previous contact with other victims. We were able to put him in touch with a professional with experience working with former members of his group and supported him when he recently went to the police and made a complaint against his abusers.

These are only two of the hundreds of requests we receive each year and responding to each one requires a considerable amount of time. Giving of our time and expertise is what we provide as assistance and support are key components of Info-Cult's mission.

But that is not all that we do and a few of our other activities include:

- Meeting with and responding to students, from high school to those doing graduate work, who are learning about cults and new religious movements;
- Providing information and giving presentations about this issue to teachers, schools, community and religious organizations, the media, law enforcement, etc...;
- Updating the collection of information and resources on our unique website [www.infocult.org](http://www.infocult.org) ;
- Responding to members of groups who are considering leaving, wanting to share information with us about their group or seeking our help in resolving a family conflict.

Info-Cult is a recognized institution in Quebec and is known throughout Canada and beyond. We want to take this opportunity to thank all the individuals, groups, organizations and institutions who have supported us in our mission for they have played an important role over the years in enabling us to provide our services to all those who have called upon us.

\*\* Channelers are people who claim entities (i.e. Jesus, some other religious figure or master) speak through them and channel knowledge and information.
